**Our Lady of Guadalupe**

The Blessed Virgin appeared on Saturday 9 Dec 1531 to a 55 year old Mexican Indian named Juan Diego, who was hurrying down Tepeyac hill to hear mass in Mexico City. She sent him to Bishop Zumarraga to ask to have a temple built where she stood. She returned to the same place that evening and Sunday evening to get the bishop's answer. The bishop did not immediately believe the messenger, and he told Juan Diego to ask the lady for a sign.

Juan asked Mary for the sign. She told him to go to the rocks and gather roses. Juan knew it was neither the time nor place for roses, but he went and found them. He gathered many into his tilma (a long cloak used by Mexican Indians). When he met with Zumarraga, Juan offered the sign to the bishop. As he unfolded the tilma, the roses, fresh and wet with dew, fell out. Juan was startled to see the bishop and his attendants kneeling before him. The life size figure of the Virgin Mother was glowing on the tilma.
